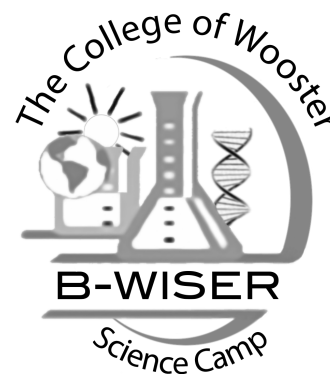

B-WISER SUMMER SCIENCE CAMP RULES AND EXPECTATIONS

Any infraction of these rules could result in restriction of privileges or immediate return to your home.

Students participating in the B-WISER Science Camp shall conduct themselves in a proper and courteous manner at all times. They shall use civil language and shall dress in appropriate attire during all events.

Campers will be assigned a specific counselor and group for the week and will be expected to stay in these assigned groups. Students follow a daily schedule – be prepared and on time for all activities.

Students are expected to be in a group of four or more persons when not in the residence hall. Campers must communicate their whereabouts with their counselor or teacher, and generally they will be escorted by their counselor.

Use of tobacco, alcohol, and illegal substances is prohibited at all times. Failure to comply will result in forfeiting your attendance at the camp with no refund.

Students are not allowed to bring any electronic devices to camp, including cell phones, smart watches, etc.

Students will not be allowed visitors during their stay unless approved by camp directors.

There will be no leaving your residence hall room after 10:30 PM. In case of emergency or illness, contact your counselor (or the camp nurse).

There will be no leaving The College of Wooster campus during the camp except in cases of emergency or pre-approved arrangements. (Note that the older B-WISEST campers require a permission slip to be bussed for Environmental Science class.)

Students will obey all safety protocols described during camp.

Students must be respectful of all other persons including other campers, counselors, teachers, and staff.

Students must be respectful of the other campers' property – remember to ask before you borrow items.

Students are responsible for their own personal belongings, clothes, and money. Student rooms should be kept locked at all times, and students must carry their key cards with them.

Guardians are financially responsible for any damage their camper causes to residence halls.
